



Complete 10 Activities from the choices below; feel free to adapt them to the interests of your child. Check off the items you and your child completed.

Make up a tune that includes your child's name.	Play "I Spy"	Sing a short song (see Rhyme Sheet)	Use a non-fiction book and make-up a story about the subject.
Discuss what your child saw when you went for a walk or a drive.	Read a book about a tree, under a tree.	Read a story about an animal, then join your child in imitating the animal.	Read a book with lots of rhymes. Add some rhyming words of your own.
As you read a book with your child, encourage the child to turn the pages.	Point out colors from a book, then using FAT crayons, let them scribble them on blank paper.	Keep a designated area for their books, and let them choose the book you read.	Use a book with pictures only and make up the story.
Cuddle with your child as you read. This helps to create a positive association with books.	Ask your child questions as you read about what they think of different parts of the story.	Using the first letter of their name, create an outline for them to trace.
