Visiting Author Returns

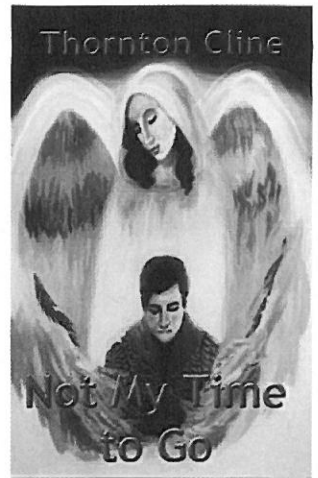

Mr. Cline will be providing several multi-media presentations for children at the area's primary schools, and he will also be holding an author talk and book signing at the library in Crewe on Wednesday, October 5 at 6:00 pm.

The Latest at the Library of Virginia

Transcribe is the Library of Virginia's collaborative online workspace where the public can participate in enhancing access to some amazing collections. It's the perfect opportunity for **volunteers to dig deep** into the collections and transcribe historic materials. From peace to wartime, court records to letters home, there will surely be something of interest to everyone.

Virginia Untold provides access points to the **individual stories of African Americans** who lived in Virginia **from the establishment of slavery in the 1600s until its demise** in 1865. Taken as a whole, these individual stories help to shed light on the narrative of a people that has not been fully told.

The **Virginia Newspaper Project** is spreading the word about a crowd-sourcing project that focuses on newspapers. **History Unfolded: US Newspapers and the Holocaust** seeks to "uncover what ordinary people around the country could have known about the Holocaust from reading their local newspapers in the years 1933-1945."

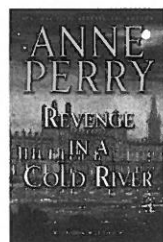

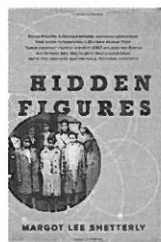
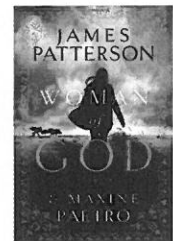
