## Library of Virginia Exhibition

Visit the Library of Virginia's Exhibition Gallery Monday through Saturday between 8:30am and 5:00pm to see *Indigenous Perspectives*. This exhibit highlights the commonwealth's Indigenous history and how the tribes remain a vital part of Virginia today.

Running through August 17, *Indigenous Perspectives* explores the voices and experiences of Virginia's tribal communities. Visiting will give you the opportunity to view excerpts from video interviews with citizens of the eleven federally and state-recognized tribes, archival records from the Library's collection, and objects contributed by the tribes that reflect their traditions and culture.
