Are You Ready to Read Beyond the Beaten Path?

Our theme for the 2023 **Summer Reading Program** is Read Beyond the Beaten Path, and we have planned **seven weeks** of activities and events with more to come! Registration is now open and, as usual, readers of all ages are welcome to take part.

You will be able to download and print the monthly reading logs from our website beginning June 12, or you can get your copy from Mrs. Nelson at the **official kick off on Saturday, June 17**. The theme for June is bugs, and she'll offer a story and activity that day at **10:30 in Blackstone and again at 12:30 in Crewe**.

Wednesday, June 21 will be the first special presentation of the program - this will be in Crewe at 6:00, and the speaker (Ms. Wilson) will be sharing her adventures on the Appalachian Trail. If you didn't see it in the May newsletter, you likely don't realize that we'll be making our way along the Trail, too. For us, though, instead of hiking, we'll be advancing one mile for each minute read with the goal of reading 2198 minutes.



We think that reading is its own reward, but a little bonus prize now and then certainly wouldn't hurt, would it? Each time you turn in your monthly reading log, you'll be able to select a little incentive. We have flashlights, water bottles, s'mores kits and more to choose from, so you're sure to find something you'll like! If you've been wondering what the latest and greatest books are, we can help with that (sort of). "Best" is subjective, of course, but we can tell you what titles have had the most circulation in the last month. In Blackstone, David Baldacci's *Simply Lies* topped the list for adult novels, and the Mary Higgins Clark memoir *Kitchen Privileges* was the item most frequently borrowed from the biography collection. When we look at Burkeville's fiction, we see that there's a tie between *Cat on the Edge* (Murphy) and *Dark Angel* (Sandford). There's no clear favorite in Crewe novels (five had the same circulation), but there was a clear winner in audiobooks - David Rosenfelt's *Dogtrippin*'.
