Celebrate Earth Day with Us throughout the month of April

This year, we're not celebrating Earth Day just once during the month... instead, after Spring Break, Ms Melissa has a variety of activities planned each week in April.

First, you'll have the chance to bring the kiddos and help - or simply watch - them **make bug hotels** using recycled water bottles, twigs, and other objects. Give it a try in Blackstone (Tues. 4/9 from 12-3), in Crewe

(Wed. 4/10 from 5-8) or in Burkeville (Thurs. 4/11 from 1-4). The following week, you'll have a chance to re-purpose old magazines to make new works of art. Join Ms Melissa at whichever time and location best suits your schedule, and let your artistic side have a little fun! She'll be making magazine mosaics on Wed. April 17 in Crewe (from 5-8), on **Thurs. April 18** in Burkeville (from 1-4), and on **Sat.** April 20 in Blackstone (from 11-2)



Officially speaking, Earth Day is April 22, and we'll be celebrating with activities throughout that week, too. Bring the kiddos and come see Ms. Melissa and learn how to turn toilet tissue into seed paper for use in your home garden. Give it a try in Blackstone (**Tues. 4/23** from 12-3), in Crewe (Wed. 4/24 from 5-8) or in Burkeville (Thurs. 4/25 from 1-4).

If your unable to make it to one or more of these programs, don't worry you'll have one more chance to try some Earth Day - or Month - activities. Each of these activities will be available at the Crewe Library on Saturday, April 27 from 11-2. Free seeds, seedlings, and more will be available for you to take home (while supplies last).

Pick up a free aluminum water bottle at the Crewe library. Like the sock collection and battery recycling, this giveaway, too, will take place

on Saturday, April 27 and is while supplies last. Why use such a water bottle? Because globally, we produce about **310 million** tons of plastic each year. That is 83 pounds per person, and plastic production is expected to quadruple by the year 2050!
