If you **prefer magazines to books**, you can **borrow these from home**, too...Thanks to the Library of Virginia, there are dozens of titles and hundreds of issues of **digital magazines** available. You can check out the latest issue of *Country Living*, *National Geographic*, the *Food Network Magazine* and more – click on RBDigital on our homepage.
